MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRIME MINISTER: The Whip's Office reports that Mr. Casselman states, this morning, in reply to an enquiry by Mr. Turgeon, last night, that whatever the government decides to do with respect to Victoria Day and Ascension Day is perfectly satisfactory to the Opposition.
