*Method of giving lustre to Silver Plate.* Dissolve a quantity of alum in water, so as to make a pretty strong brine, which you must skim very carefully ; add some soap to it, and when you wish to use it, dip a piece of linen rag in it and rub it over your pieces of plate. This process will add much to its lustre.
