

GLEN WILLIAMS.

A post village situated on the Credit River, in the Township of Esquesing. It possesses good water power, and is distant from Toronto 30 miles, from Guelph 20, and 14 miles from Milton. It contains a Methodist Episcopal Church, Rev. S. Morrison, minister; a good grist mill, and a new extensive woolen factory carried on by Mr. Chas. Williams, there are also two saw mills; Mr. Tweedale does a large business in cutting lumber and laths. The improved pump and bobbin factory of Messrs. J. Hunt & Co., claims notice; Mr. Wm Tosh, general blacksmith, attends promptly to all orders in his line; John Cook, hotel keeper, has ample accommodation for all who may favor him with a call, while everything in the grocery line may be had at Watkin's grocery store.

There is a Lodge of I. O. of G. T., No. 552, presided over by Mr. John Standish, jun., W.C.T.

A last factory, a blacksmith shop, and a waggon shop are also in this growing village. Population, 250.
