CAMPBELLTON. Oxford County.
A discontinued post office, it now forms
part of the town of Tilsonburg, which see
for Directory.

CAMPBELLVILLE. A village on
Sixteen Mile creek (which furnishes power)
and on the C V line C P Ry, in Nassagaweya
township, Halton County, 7 miles west of
Milton, the county seat and nearest banking
point. Settled in 1850. It contains Metho-
dist and Presbyterian churches, and com-
mon school, and ships cordwood, lumber
and flour. Stage daily to Brookville, fare
25c. Population, 125. Telegraph, GNW.
