HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-west Torritories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood bats for actives, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the size head of a family, or of onequative size years upon the size of the size of the size of the pears of the size of the size of the size of the pears of the size of the size of the size of the of 160 acres hore or less.

ENTRY.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans:-

(1) At least six months' residence upon and ultivation of the land in each year during the cultivation of the la term of three years.

(2) If the failur (or mother, if the father is decaared) or any permy who is eligible to make decaared or any permy the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the and entered for by such person as a home-stead, the requirements of this Act as to re-sidence prior to obtaining matent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a pasent for his homotexist, or a co-winduct for the lasts of homotexist, or a co-winduct for the lasts of section by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homostead, the requirements of this Act and to resist the homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant o indicate the same township or an adjoining r cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2) (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homesteal Inspector. Before making applica-tion for patent the settler must give aix months notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION
