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Law Says Telegraph Operators **Must Have Shorter Hours**

On March I next the law governing the hours of duty of all the tolegraph operators through out the United States will be put into operation. During the past years it has been the entough at the smaller railroad stations for operators to work twelve hours per day, but now the law says that eight hours shall constitute a day's work.

This means that where two operators are employed during the twenty-fours hours three will be required, thus necessitating an extra operator at nearly every station in the country, estimated at nearly tenthousand. The demand for the telegraph operator will be something enorm us and already the officials of the various railroads are straining every effort to be able to meet the conditions.

The high salaries of the operators and the exceptional abort hours of duty make the trade one of the best paying propositions a young man or woman can follow.

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
