1.-Change of the source of the water supply.

2.-Installation of a system of sewers and their appurtenances.

The system of waterworks comprises the following:-

- (A) Laying 15,000 feet of 10" cast iron delivery pipe, with necessary valves, etc., with 330 feet of 12" intake pipe.
- (B) New pumping station of brick 60' x 24', and Engineer's dwelling of brick veneer.
- (C) Supply and erection of 75 H. P. Boiler.
- (D) Steel stack 30' diameter, 60 feet high.
- (E) Removal and re-erection of present plant.

The system of sewers comprises the following:-

- (A) Supplying and laying 30,000 feet of 8" to 12" sewer pipe with manholes, flush tanks, etc.
- (B) Construction of two Septic Tanks of concrete, each 100' x 40'.
