BISHOP SHAHAN

ON IDEALS OF AMERICAN DEMOCRACY

In an address delivered at the 'Win the War for Permanent Peace' convention held recently in Phila-delphia, Right Rev. Thomas F. Shahan rector of the Catholic University, Washington, D. C., declared the political ideals of mankind which the United States of America is now effecting so closely and finally are, of course, the ideals of American Democracy.

Whatever their remote sources said Bishop Shahan, "whatever the degree of influence accorded to certain factors of foreign origin, American Democracy is a native growth. It absorbed at once and transmuted all racial or derived elements. It appears in the political order as a new form of government, alive with a new spirit, breathing a new pur-pose, and shaping new tools with which to realize its aims. 
