RESOLVED, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that some regulations are necessary and requisite for the Pilotage of Scows and Rafts through the rapids from *Chateauguay* to *Montreal*.

ORDERED, That the question of concurrence be now severally put on the said resolutions.

Accordingly the said resolutions were again severally read, and the question being separately put upon each, they were severally agreed unto by the House.
