### *Bills sent up by the Assembly.*

Report. Order that the same be recommitted, 94. Said order discharged, 98.

To grant an Annuity to such Militiamen as were wounded during the late War with the United States of America, and to apply a sum of Money therein mentioned, to aid and assist His Majesty in defraying the expences of the Militia incurred during the said War, and also to indemnify certain Officers of Militia, and the Families of such Militiamen as were killed in the said War. Received by Message and read a first time, 98. Governor's Assent, that the House may proceed thereon, 100, 101. Read a second time, 101. House in Committee on the Bill. Report with amendments. They are agreed to by the House, 104. And ordered to be engrossed, 105. The Bill and amendments recommitted, 108. Report. The engrossed amendments rejected. Protest, 109. The Bill read a third time. Passed. Acquiescence of the House signified to the Assembly, 115. Royal Assent, 124, 125.

To provide for the holding of the Provincial Court of Appeals during the repairs to be done to the Court House at Quebec. Received by Message. Read a first time, 98. Read a second time, 100. House in Committee on the Bill. Report without amendment. Read a third time. Passed, and acquiescence of the House signified to the Assembly, 103. Royal Assent, 122.

To continue for a limited time two Acts therein mentioned, for the better regulation of the Lumber Trade. Received by Message, 98. Read a first time, 99. Read a second time, 100. House in Committee on the Bill. Report without amendment. Read a third time. Passed, and acquiescence of the House signified to the Assembly, 104. Royal Assent, 121.

To grant a Salary to the Speaker of the Legislative Council of Lower Canada, to enable him to support the dignity of his office during the present Provincial Parliament. Received by Message. Read a first time, 99. Second Reading postponed to the 1st day of August next, 100.
