On Motion of Mr. Belcher, resolved, That his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor be addressed to permit by Proclamation after the 18th November next ensuing, the Importation only, of Scantling, Planks, Staves, Heading Boards, Shingles, Hoops or squared Timber of any Sort; Bread, Biscuit, Flour, Pease, Wheat, Rice, Oats, Barley or Grain of any Sort, and to prohibit the importation of every other Article whatever from the United States of America.

Resolution respecting Importation of Articles from the United States.

Ordered. That Major Barclay, Col. Tonge, and Mr. Belcher, be a Order thereon. Committee to prepare an Address accordingly.

A Petition of Benjamin Bridge, was presented by Mr. Morris, and read, fetting forth, that the Petitioner has been appointed Captain of the Fire Engine Company in Halifax, and praying, that the Law relating to faid Establishment may be amended, to enable him to execute his Duty more fully, and advantageously, to the Public.

Petition of Benjamin Bridge, presented.

Ordered, That the Petition do lie on the Table.
