

The Bill to facilitate the winding up of the affairs of Incorporated Companies;

With certain amendments, to which they desire the concurrence of the Assembly.

The amendments made by the Council to—The Bill to amend an Act to alter and amend Chapter 22, Title iii, of the Revised Statutes, 'Of Sick and Disabled Seamen,'—were read a first time, and are as follow:—

At A, Section 2, expunge the word "Consignee."

At B, in same Section, expunge the word "three," and insert the word "two."

The amendment made by the Council to—The Bill to facilitate the winding up of the affairs of Incorporated Companies,—was read a first time, and is as follows:—

At A, Section 2, add the following words—"Provided that any such proceeding of any Judge shall be subject to appeal to the whole Court in Term."

The House again went into Committee of the whole on—A Bill to amend an Act intituled "An Act in amendment and consolidation of the Laws relating to Highways."

The Chairman reported, that the Committee had the Bill referred to them again under their consideration, and agreed to the same.

Ordered, That the Report be accepted and the Bill engrossed.
