A sad and fatal accident occurred at Kingsport last Friday afternoon, by which Mr. Alonzo White lost his life. The unfortunate man was at work painting on the ship Harvest Queen, which is undergoing repairs at the Kingsport wharf. He lost his balance and fell backwards a distance of about twenty feet, striking the stage below and sustaining such injuries as to cause his death a few hours later. Mr. White was a native of Boston, and served in the civil war. For a number of years he has resided in this county, and for some time lived in Wolfville. He leaves a widow, a sister of Mr. J. M. Shaw, of this town, and several children. The funeral, which took place at Kingsport on Sunday, was largely attended.
