VICE-REGAL VISITS.

How Dufferin, Lorne Lansdowne and Stanley

Were Welcomed to Fredericton.

The topic uppermost in the minds of Frederictonians at the present time, is the approaching visit of the Governor General and Lady Aberdeen, and the manner in which they will be received, and this suggests and recalls the visits and reception of former Governors General.

Dufferin's Visit. Lord Dufferin was the first Governor General of Canada to officially visit Fredericton, and accompanied by Lady Dufferin and his staff, he arrived here from St. John August 2nd, 1873.
