

Legislative Council.

THURSDAY, Aug. 11.
The House met at 4 p.m. and after two hours' session cleared off nearly all the outstanding business. The Revenue Bill was given a first reading, and will go to the second stage this afternoon. The Sheep Farming Bill, which was on the Order Paper for a considerable time, has disappeared. The Warehouse Receipts Bill has been sent to a Select Committee. The second reading of a Bill respecting Banks and Chattel Mortgages, which was introduced at the sitting has been deferred. The business of the day during the evening was the Bill dealing with illegitimate Children, which went through all its stages. The Public Service Act also passed. The Sales Tax Bill brought forth a lot of questioning by both sides of the House, as there were many points in the Bill that were not dealt with.

The President of the Council enquired if the tax was to be collected by articles for church use. Mr. T. F. McGrath pointed out that these articles were not exempt. While debating this matter he proposed the question what is raw material within the meaning of the act and did the manufacturer have to pay double tax if he bought his materials from an importer. He cited a baker who buying yeast, currants or other ingredients locally paid the 5% on the articles after manufacture. Mr. G. Winter said he understood that the manufacturer was to be protected to some extent. Mr. John Anderson also joined in a discussion. Before the Bill went through a rather awkward situation arose, as it was discovered that in the document the wording "being a money bill the Council could not make any amendment" was inserted. The Bill was as it was suggested by Sir J. McGrath that it pass all its stages in the form in which it was sent up but that the Assembly should be satisfied that an alternative was necessary. The suggestion was adopted.

The Income Tax Bill was put through all its stages. When in Committee Sir P. T. McGrath took occasion to object to the principle of extending the Governor and the Judges to the Supreme Court from this tax. England not even the King is exempt. He would not advocate that the present Governor should be made liable, because he came here under a man understanding, but there was reason why the tax should not apply in the case of future Governors. He should not be allowed travelling expenses more than their official duties called for. All the economy that was not to be practiced at the expense of the Governor and the Judges and it was only fair that the men who were being exempted by the Bill should contribute their quota to the revenue. He suggested that the Bill relating to the salaries of servants upon its second reading spoken to by Hon. George Shea, should be referred to the Finance Committee. He was devolved upon him the charge of this Bill. He knew that it would bear hard on a large number of the civil servants, but the revenue of the colony. There was alternative left to the Governor. He had to choose between the fact that drastic action had to be taken. He hoped that the future might be brighter, so that the hardship imposed could be removed.

Mr. T. F. McGrath, in reply, said every one feels that the Government might have refrained from dealing with the smaller salaries, and had acted more wisely if they left them untouched. Economy is necessary it could be practiced in other directions, one of which is the topping off of the new National Department. Money also have been saved where it has been spent on works that give no returns. Sir Patrick, regarding the general condition of the colony referred to the various sources of revenue particularly Bell Island and the West Coast fishing industry. Valuing codfish at 10¢ per quintal, Sir Patrick gave it his opinion that seven and a half per cent in revenue would be a very good amount that we could expect. In the interim serious action would be given to the railway.

The Bill passed all its stages, after which the Revenue Act was given a second and third reading being deferred until this afternoon's sitting. The House adjourned at 6 p.m. on Thursday, August 11th.
