the Triennial Appraisement, and also of the Election; and the Court of Revision—both of Voters' Lists and Pro-perty—was being held at the City Hall. This was all intensified by the fact that the Charter was late in passing, and that the election had to be held not later than the control of election until March, but found that it could not be done, as it would require an Act of Parliament to alter the date. We therefore consuited with Mr. Doyle—who was afterward commissioned by the Colonial Secretary as Returning Officer—in regard to the enumeration and the possibility of carrying out the election.
