

Her displacement when submerged will be 3,600 tons, 1,400 tons greater than that of the largest German submarine and considerably greater than any of the existing American types. On the surface the X-1 will use steam for navigation, but when sub-

There is a great diversity of opinion regarding the size of the new vessel's armament. In some quarters it is said she will mount a gun of 12 or 13.5-inch calibre. It is possible, however, that the X-1 has been designed for a high surface speed, enabling her to work with the Grand Battle Fleet. If this is true a big




