SASKATCHEWAN HAS TROUBLE WITH G.T.P.

There Seems to be Trouble of
Government Withdrawing
Guarantee of Bonds

According to information published in the Western Herald, the Scott government and the Grand Trunk Pacific Branch Lines Company are at loggerheads, and there is a possibility of the government withdrawing its guarantee of bonds. This situation results from the railway company ignoring the order of the government in respect to the lines now under construction south of Regina. The Herald says:

Setting at defiance the Scott government, the Grand Trunk Pacific has decided to work to construct its line from Regina southward to the Canadian border following the route originally proposed by the company through the village of Griffin and through the town of Weyburn as has been urged upon the company by the provincial government.

On Tuesday of this week two construction gangs began grading operations about fifteen miles north of Weyburn, and the sub-contractors claim to have orders to build the line along the original route in the direction of Griffin as speedily as possible.

The news that the G. T. P. had begun grading operations through Griffin caused much disappointment when it reached town on Wednesday, as it would be held enough to proceed with any portion of the work in direct opposition to the express wish of the government to whom the company must look for the guarantee of its bonds.

The company's actions are said to confirm the opinion held by a few, that Jim Hill, the American railway king, is financing the building of the line, and as a result the company may feel they can proceed independent of a guarantee of bonds.

ISOLATED AND CONTINUES TO INSIST THAT THE DEADLOCK HAS RESULTED IS A BLUFF?

If the step taken by the G. T. P. is only a bluff, some seem to think it is an expensive move of bluff for grading costs money. The more popular theory is that the G.T.P. failing to move the government by its latest play will eventually bow to the government's will, deviate its line so as to pass through Weyburn, and having set its bonds guaranteed by doing so, build without any guarantee a direct line across through Griffin from the point of deviation north of Weyburn to where the bond guarantee line strikes the original route south of Griffin, and having done so, run its fast trains through Griffin, and not through Weyburn. This would be a plan of revenge upon Weyburn which may at the present time be evolving in the fertile brain of President Hayes.

SOLDIER OF FORTUNE WANTS POSITION Kaid Belton, Who Commanded Moroccan Forces, Seeks Commis- sion in Canada

Ottawa, May 23.—In Ottawa today is the only man alive who put one monarch off a throne and another, his half-brother, on one.

This man is Kaid Belton, known throughout the world as Kaid Belton (Kaid in the Moroccan army being equivalent to Commander-in-Chief). This intrepid young Englishman is now staying at the Russell House.

He is the man who put Mulai Hand on the throne of Morocco—this achievement gaining for him the title of "Kingmaker."

He left his home in England at the age of seventeen and from then until now—his twenty-eight—has been an active military career. He received a commission in an English regiment when only nineteen and a captaincy a few years later in the Zululand campaign.

Then in 1908 he was through several battles in the Zululand campaign.
