Birds Fly From Cholera.

Birds Fly From Cholera.

A curious circumstance in connection with the recent-pidemic of cholera at Hamburg was the departure of all the birds from the city a few days prior to the cutbreak. Numerous recerds exist of birds thus suddenly disappearing from plagues threatened centers, and throughout the world these flittings are generally looked upon as omens of appreaching sickness. Thus in the summer of 1884, when the cholera was raging at Marseilles and Toulon, all the birds, as if actuated by a common impulse, abandoned these two cities and suddenly resorted to Hyeres. The latter place enjoyed a complete immunity from cholera, and the extraordinary influx of birds there attracted much attention at the time. Similar migrations have been observed in various parts of Italy, Austria and Russia just before the advent of cholera, and in Gallcia, especially in the summer of 1872, all the sparrows suddenly quitted the town of Prezmsyl x comple of days before the appearance of the pest, and not a single bird returned until the end of November, when the cholera had entirely disappeared.


