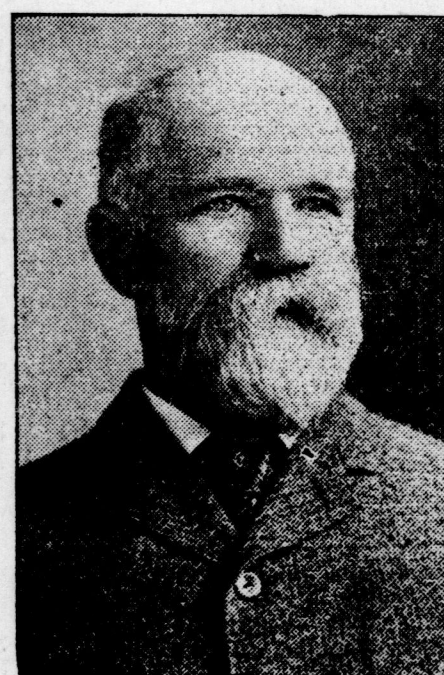

A BALKAN REVOLT

A Fresh Insurrection Started by the Albanians.

London, March 5.—In a dispatch from Salonica, European Turkey, a correspondent of the Daily Mail says fresh insurrection has broken out in Albania. The districts of Mitrovitz and Ipek are in open revolt, and the Turkish authorities appear to be demoralized.

Vienna, March 5.—It is reported from Belgrade that the Government has ordered the arrest of a number of Macedonian revolutionists in consequence of an insurgent attempt to cross the frontier.
