The finance committee will have an overdraft of \$1.834. Of this amount \$1.177 was for the consolidation of the city bylaws, for which there were no estimates. In addition, the printing bill was fully \$1,500 in excess of the estimates, and other bills ran up well. The law expenses and compensation for injuries was smaller than the estimates, some \$500, giving the committee a little leverage.

Board of Works.

The board of works also fell behind over \$2,000, or to be exact just \$2,-092 81.
