SNOW SPOILED TODAY'S MARKET

Two Much for Wheels and Not Enough for Sleighing. EGGS WERE VERY PLENTIFUL. At Thirty Cents a Dozen, But Sales Were Very Slow.

The market this morning was a particularly small one, owing to the snow, which made wheels practically useless, and which was hardly sufficient to make good sleighing.

Sales were slow in all lines, with the result that prices were anything but firm. Oats went up to \$1.25 per hundredweight, during the past week, and are now selling from \$1.07 to \$1.18.

One lady alone occupied the shed. Butter was quoted on the open market at 28 cents for dairy. Eggs were plentiful at 30 cents a dozen for fresh.

A considerable quantity of meats were on the square, but sales were very slow. Prices, however, remained firm.

Weight Scales Clerk Dean is now deducting 20 pounds from each load of hay when a farmer removes a certain amount for feed for their horses after the load has been weighed.

It is understood that an effort will be made to give the clerk power to deduct what he thinks is proper when there is a quantity of snow on the road. It is thought that this method will be just as purchasers do not like to pay for snow.

A TRUE BILL. Hamilton, Jan. 12.—At the assizes a true bill was returned by the grand jury against M. M. Robinson, sporting editor of the Spectator, charged with criminally libelling F. C. Mills, sporting editor of the Times. The case will likely be proceeded with today. It is said that Crown Attorney Washington and Crown Counsel Gwyn are at the case. It is further stated that the dispute has been referred to the attorney-general for settlement.

STRICKEN BLIND. Chatham, Jan. 12.—On Saturday, while Mrs. James Wardell was preparing to go to Hamilton to attend the wedding of her son, she fell off her porch and broke her wrist. She was lying on the ground helpless when her husband found her. When Mr. Wardell saw the condition of his wife he became so excited that he was stricken stone blind. He remained in that state for several hours.

JOHN BURT DEAD. Listowel, Jan. 11.—Mr. John C. Burt, for 14 years the representative of Brophy Cains, Limited, Montreal, and one of the most successful and popular travellers in Western Ontario, died this morning, aged 65 years. The funeral takes place Wednesday afternoon.

LONDON'S FIRST APARTMENT HOUSE. Splendid Structure Erected by John Hayman & Sons.

London's first apartment-house has been completed by John Hayman & Sons, the local contractors, being situated on Queen's avenue, east of Wellington street.

The exterior of the building is magnificent red pressed brick, with porches for each apartment at front and back. The front porches are supported by huge Ionic columns.

The floors of the vestibule and bathrooms are all made of tile having been installed by the Barton Netting Company, of Windsor.

The front door is never locked, but the vestibule door is kept closed by means of an electric lock, which can be opened by means of a key or by either side of the vestibule is a large slab of marble
