GERMANS IN LOWICZ CLOSE TO WARSAW

Von Hindenburg Declares the Enormous Losses Have Not Broken Russians.

POSEN, army headquarters of the East, December 18, via Berlin and London, Dec. 20.—(Delayed in transmission).—Field Marshal Von Hindenburg's army took Lowicz, Russian Poland, today, defeating the Russian land, today, after heavy fighting for several days. The capture of the city compelled the further retirement of the Russian lines, which have lost 24 kilometers (15 miles), since the evacuation of Lowicz. The lines are now scarcely 10 kilometers from Warsaw. The German pursuit is proceeding successfully along the whole front, but

the Russians are offering a firm resistance in positions which were previously fortified in preparation for a retreat. The resistance of the Russians has by no means been fully broken, but their losses in the most recent battles have been enormous.

Russian Losses Enormous. Field Marshal Von Hindenburg, in whose headquarters the Associated Press correspondent arrived today for the purpose of observing further operations, says that the Russian losses since November 13, including about 100,000 prisoners, have been enormous. Even the killed and wounded at Tannenberg, East Prussia, says General Von Hindenburg, cannot be compared with the losses of the Russians in the present battle. Great masses of Russians were captured at Tannenberg, but by no means so many were killed and wounded as in the present battles, according to the general's estimates of the operations.

Field Marshal Von Hindenburg and Gen. Von Ludendorff, his chief of staff, do not share the optimistic views expressed in certain Berlin newspapers, which regard the Russians now as finally disposed of.

Long Way to Warsaw Yet. The opinion expressed here is that the Russians probably will be unable to resume offensive operations, but that they still form a powerful army, and that there is yet much to be done before the Germans can establish winter quarters at Warsaw.

Loicz suffered comparatively little from the battle, but Lowicz was considerably damaged by a bombardment from both sides. The field marshal gave a brief survey of the recent operations causing the evacuation of Loicz, which drove a wedge into the Russian lines, thus becoming a decisive victory. The whole Russian line, he said, later was compelled to retreat, but no breach has been made in it, as the Russian com-

KAISER SPREADS REPORT OF VICTORY.

KARLSRUHE, via Berlin to London, Dec. 20.—Grand Duchess Louise of Baden, has received the following telegram from William: "Field Marshal Von Hindenburg has just reported that the Russian army, after desperate fighting, retreats, and is being pursued along the entire front. It is evident that the Lord aided our heroic troops. To Him alone is due the honors."

REPORTS GALICIA CLEAR OF RUSSIANS.

LONDON, Dec. 20.—According to a Berlin wireless dispatch, advice from Vienna to main headquarters says that in the battle of Limanowa the Russian troops completely routed the Austrian, of which Western Galicia is now clear.

MEXICANS WILL KEEP THEIR BULLETS AT HOME

WASHINGTON, Dec. 20.—Consular Agent Carruthers telegraphed the State Department today that Gov. Maytorena, commanding the forces besieging Gen. Hill's garrison at Naco, Sonora, was prepared to withdraw his troops to a point ten or twelve miles from the border to eliminate the possibility of further firing into American territory.
