
"To the men that go down to the sea in ships" is the inscription on this monument erected to commemorate the 300th anniversary of the founding of Gloucester, Massachusetts

When Mrs. Silver of Letcombe, Wantage, England, goes motoring she takes a competent protector—a young lion




These winged figures greet visitors at the town limits of Penetanguishene, Ont.
