ELECT SENATORS BY POPULAR VOTE

WASHINGTON, June 12.—The reception which the president and Mrs. Taft will give June 15, the twenty-fifth anniversary of their marriage, probably will be the most largely attended function ever held in the White House. More than 3,000 invitations already have been sent out and each day the president is suggesting more names, so that the lowest estimate is that 4,000 will be invited and that of these at least three-fourths will attend.
