

**How to Make a Tump.**

A tump makes a fair substitute for a cellar in emergencies when cellar room is wanting to care for produce subject to injury by freezing. Potatoes, root crops, and even apples may be kept in good condition all winter if properly tumped. Care should be taken to choose a place for the tump where the ground is dry and well drained. A tump made in the shape of a round mound is better than one made with a ridge, since it is easier to protect a given quantity of potatoes or the like from frost by a circular mound than by an oblong one. Dig a pit to a level below the local frost line, cover the bottom of the pit with dry straw, pile the vegetables or fruit to be tumped upon this straw, pack straw over the top of the pile, then bank up all around with a deep covering of earth. The surface of the tump should be closely packed, so as to shed as much water as possible. It is a good plan still further to protect it from rain and snow by a roof of some sort, if only an old tarpaulin or piece of oilcloth.

- (f) CANADIAN CONTINGENT.
- (g) British Expeditionary Force.
- (h) Army Post Office, London, England.
