MARINE AND FISHERIES REPORT.

The total amount expended for light-house service, signal stations, fog whistles, etc., in the Province for the fiscal year ending 31st Dec, 1884, was \$142,909.72. For light-houses in the county the expenditure was as follows: Isle au Haut, \$683.55; Port Louis, \$233.70; Margarettown, \$299.85. For buoys and beacons, Bear River, \$115.06.

The number of vessels on the registry books for this county on 31st Dec, 1884, was 93, including 2 steamers, representing a gross tonnage of 292 tons. There were but two vessels registered during the year. In the whole Province there were 2,942 vessels, and 74 steamers registered, representing a gross tonnage of 546,048 tons.

In the whole Dominion the increase in the number of vessels in twelve years has only been 134, and in tonnage an increase of 94,348 tons. The total number of Canadian vessels, reported to the department of marine and fisheries, is 10,000, having increased since 1870, from 8,000 to 10,000.

If the United States Government refuse to renew the Fishery clauses of the Washington Treaty of July 1859, it only remains for our Government to adopt proper measures to protect our fishermen and their toil from encroachments of the American fishing fleet.
