

Potential Mood formed as usual from the Present and Perfect of the Indicative.

IMPERATIVE MOOD.

Ouubeēsen, cause thou me to see.

Ouubeēseg, cause ye me to see.

Ouubeēsenuum, cause thou or ye us to see.

INDICATIVE MOOD.

Present Tense.

Sin.

Neouubeuug, I cause them to see him.

Geouubeuug, thou causest them to see him.

Oouubeūun, he causes them to see him.

Plu.

Neouubeunuuneg, we cause them to see him.

Geouubeuuouug, you cause them to see him.

Oouubeuuouun, they cause them to see him.

Imperfect Tense.

Sin

Neouubeubuneeg, I caused them to see him.

Geouubeubuneeg, thou caused them to see him.

Oouubeubuneen, he caused them to see him.

Plu

Neouubeumenuubuneeg, we caused them to see.

Geouubeuuoubuneeg, ye caused them to see.

Ooubeuuoubuneen, they caused them to see.

The Perfect, Pluperfect and Future Tenses of the Indicative with the Present and Perfect of the Potential as usual.

INDICATIVE MOOD.

Sin

Ooubeegoog, they cause me to see

Geoubeēgoog, they cause you to see.

Neoubeēgoon, they cause him to see
