Prague 1950-54: (Commercial Secretary and Consul), British Embassy, Czechoslovakia.

Wellington 1954: Head of Chancery, British High Commission, New Zealand.

Paris 1957-59: Commercial Secretary/Counsellor, British Embassy, France.

Hong Kong 1959-62: Colonial Office (Political Advisor for Hong Kong).

London 1963: In charge of Far East Department of Foreign Office.

London 1966-67: Principal Private Secretary to Foreign Secretary, Mr. Micheal Stewart and later Mr. George Brown.

1967 - 1969 Ambassador to Viet Nam.
