minutes of CD meetings have not been covered. Nor have submissions to ad hoc committees.

- United Nations publications. The United Nations has been active in the field of verification in two ways: as a source of research and as a forum for deliberation. The Bibliography includes UN General Assembly and Security Council resolutions pertaining to verification and submissions on this subject from the Secretary General as well as the national members of the UN. Also covered are relevant UN Secretary General studies and a number of research publications by the United Nations Institute for Disarmament Research (UNIDIR).
- Other international organizations. Several other organizations besides the CD and the UN have dealt with verification issues. Two such organizations are the International Atomic Energy Agency and the Western European Union. The Bibliography has indexed a number of documents from both organizations. Budgetary and other similar annual documents, however, have not been included.
- National governments. English language governmental publications have been included in the bibliography. Canadian publications make up a large proportion of these documents, but there are also a number of American and British documents.
- Academic publications. The Bibliography contains books, reports, articles and papers submitted at various conferences, and individual academic papers appearing in a variety of journals. Where the contents of conference publications are of particular interest, articles have been listed individually.
- International Treaties and Agreements. The texts of international treaties and agreements have <u>not</u> been covered by this Bibliography.

Arrangement

The bibliography is arranged alphabetically in descending order of priority by:

- author,
- corporate author,
- article title, and
- book or document title.

All entries follow a standard bibliographic style.
