the short term and to contribute to its long term economic development. Mr. Clark will also invite a Minister of the Government of Mozambique to be present in Vancouver in October because of the importance of Mozambique in any discussion by Heads of Government of the situation in Southern Africa.

During his working visit to <u>South Africa</u>, Mr. Clark will meet with the Minister of Foreign Affairs, Mr. R. F. Botha. Mr. Clark's objective in holding talks with Mr. Botha will be to convey in person to the South African Government Canadian policy on <u>apartheid</u>. In concert with others, we will continue to exert pressure on the South African Government to dismantle <u>apartheid</u> and achieve an early, peaceful and negotiated solution to the crisis. It is now more than a year since the rejection of the invitation to dialogue issued by the Commonwealth Eminent Persons Group. Mr. Clark will want to hear from Mr. Botha about South Africa's intentions to initiate fundamental change and talk with leaders who have widespread support among the black majority. While in South Africa, Mr. Clark will also be meeting with the Rev. Alan Boesak.
