#### PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND GOVERNMENT PROGRESS

#### 1) New Sites

- 16 new sites (involving 29 properties) were designated under the Natural Areas Protection Act.
- 7 new private reserves were established.

# 2) Systems Planning Progress

• The Endangered Spaces goals were endorsed. The government of PEI, in cooperation with private citizens, will endeavor to protect representative examples of each of seven habitat types and secure protection for 75% of the 40,300 Ha containing environmentally significant sites and adjacent buffer land on PEI by the year 2000. This represents a goal of protecting 7% of provincial land, coastal and inland water system. In terms of number of sites, by the year 2000 the government of PEI will endeavor to secure protection for parcels on at least 70 of the 94 sites identified as significant environmental areas.

## 3) Action Planned for 1992-93

• 25 sites will be designated for protection under the Natural Areas Protection Act by spring 1992.

### NEWFOUNDLAND/LABRADOR GOVERNMENT PROGRESS

### 1) New Sites

• Two new Migratory Bird Sanctuaries were established.

## 2) Systems Planning Progress

- Endorsement has been made by the Premier to the Endangered Spaces goals.
- Agreement has been reached by the Federal Government, Native groups and the Provincial Government to proceed with feasibility studies for two national park candidates; the Torngat Mountains and Mealy Mountains.
- Planning is underway to designate 5 Ecological Reserves in 1992.
