Question No. 1,875—Mr. Mazankowski:

What are the names and positions of Air Canada executives making more than \$25,000 per year (a) which ones have been (i) promoted through Air Canada ranks (ii) recruited from outside ranks (b) how long has each worked for Air Canada (c) how long has each been in his present position?

Hon. Jean Marchand (Minister of Transport): The management of Air Canada advises as follows: Information concerning individual salaries of Air Canada executives has traditionally been treated as proprietary. To

reveal this information while other Canadian airlines are not required to do so could be prejudicial to Air Canada's position in a highly competitive manpower market. A list of names and positions of Air Canada executives, as well as their length of service with the company is attached. (a)(i)(ii) All those named on attached list may be said to have been promoted through company ranks with the exception of Mr. Y. Pratte, Mr. P. J. Chartrand and Mr. L. M. Raverty.
