REQUEST THAT GOVERNMENT CREATE JOBS IN VALLEYFIELD REGION, P.Q.—MOTION UNDER S.O. 43

The Valleyfield area in Quebec has just been severely affected by factory shutdowns. Nearly 1,200 workers were laid off in the past few days at Dupont of Canada and Dominion Textiles.

In view of the abject failure of the federal government's industrial strategy, and the fact that so little attention is paid to victims of factory shutdowns, I move, seconded by the member for Dauphin (Mr. Lewycky):
