Mr. Bill Blaikie (Winnipeg—Birds Hill): Mr. Speaker, rumours are abounding again about CN's plans to centralize its corporate structure, and CN President Lawless has been quick to deny any plan to close its regional headquarter offices in western Canada. At least, he has not confirmed the rumours.

However, we in Winnipeg are familiar with the process. We remember the denials of 1985, that the prairie region head-quarters was not going to disappear, and along with it all kinds of senior jobs to Edmonton, and all the while it was actually happening. That was eventually stopped, but I am told that the jobs continue to bleed away to Edmonton in a much less controversial fashion.

I call upon Manitoba Tory Members of Parliament and all western Tories to defend western Canada, both Winnipeg and Edmonton, against any possible centralization of this sort.

While I am at it, I call upon the Minister of National Health and Welfare (Mr. Epp) to make good on the work he is doing to bring the new centre for viral disease control to Winnipeg as a complement to the excellent health sciences sector which already exists in Winnipeg. If Winnipeg were to get this very worth-while project, it would certainly go some way toward alleviating the sting of the CF-18.

TWENTY-THIRD ANNUAL QUEBEC GAMES AT VAL-D'OR
