"REVIEW OF ACT

40. (1) On the expiration of three years after the coming into force of this Act, this Act shall be referred to such committee of the Senate, of the House of Commons or of both Houses of Parliament as may be designated or established for the purpose of reviewing this Act.

(2) The committee to which this Act is referred shall review the Act and submit a report thereon to the House or Houses of Parliament of which it is a committee, including a statement of any changes the committee recommends.

COMING INTO FORCE

41. This Act shall come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council."

Mr. Lorne Nystrom (Yorkton—Melville) moved:

Motion No. 62.

That Bill C-81 be amended by deleting Clause 40 and substituting the following therefor:

"40. (1) This Act shall come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor Council and, subject to subsections (2) and (3) shall remain in force for a period of three years.

(2) At any time while this Act is in force, both Houses of Parliament may, by joint resolution, direct that it shall continue in force for a further specified period from, or indefinitely after, the day on which it would otherwise expire.

(3) Where this Act ceases to be in force after the issue of a proclamation and before all requirements of this Act have been met in respect of the referendum held as a result of that proclamation or before all proceedings arising during or out of that referendum have been completed, this Act shall be deemed to continue in force in respect of that referendum until all such requirements have been met and all such proceedings have been completed."

That Bill C-81 be amended in Clause 40 by striking out lines 15 to 19 at page 30 and substituting the following therefor:
