Though it is perhaps hardly seemly for me to presume to speak personally of the late Colonel Herbert Molson, yet in the little time during which I enjoyed the honor of his friendship I learned quickly of the sterling qualities of the man, of his sincerity, of his high sense of duty, of his loyalty to his friends and to the many causes with which he identified himself, and of the affection which he inspired in all who knew him.

Speaking on behalf of the University, may I say that we have lost one of our most ^{loyal} devoted governors, the latest in the long line of this remarkable family to devote their time and their money to the advancement of its work. Colonel Herbert Molson became a Governor in 1918, upon his return from rendering gallant service in the War. His devotion and loyalty to his former General, the late Principal Sir Arthur Currie, are remembered by all who knew both men. He accompanied Sir Arthur Currie on his 1920 tour of Canada when the graduates of McGill were rallied to the support of their Alma Mater, and year by year ~~he~~ never spared himself in the ^{Cause} ~~service~~ of the
