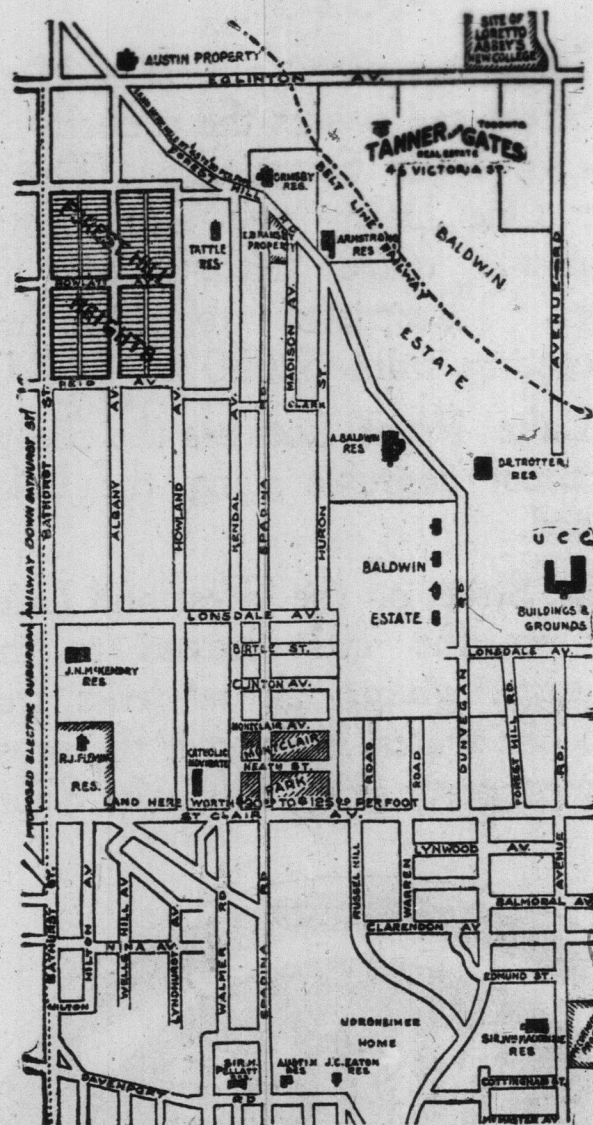

TWO SHAFTS GOING DOWN
AT PHILADELPHIA MINE

Deloro Properties Being Proven Up
at Depth—Foreign Capital
Interested.

PORCUPINE CITY, May 20.—(From Our Main Up North.)—With two shafts down 60 and 80 feet respectively, and every effort being made to cross-cut to connect up the two openings in as short a time as possible, the Philadelphia Porcupine Mines, in the extreme north-east part of Deloro and northwest shore next to the Whitney line, mark the most easterly spot in this section of Deloro where prospecting work is under way at present.

The work is in what the superintendent calls a dyke, a very wide stretch of quartz running thru a ridge of schist, which takes almost a west and east strike. Free gold values have been found in the rock carrying sulphides. Carr Phillips, who has been in charge of the work on the mine, left recently for Swatara where he will spend two months prospecting claims which he staked there two years ago.

The Philadelphia-Porcupine Mines are backed principally by foreign capital and not until the claims are thoroughly worked out and the value determined will the company issue stock to the public. The group of claims on which work is now proceeding were staked over last December. During the winter months were built and preparations made for spring work. Enough prospecting had been done during the fall before snow came to make it possible to tell where shafts should go down, and early in January sinking was started.

Toward the last of April two small boilers and steam hoists were added to the equipment, and now depth is being made more rapidly. Surface prospecting is also underway. The formation here is similar to that found on Southern Whiteley.

HUNTING FOR NEW LEADS
AT UNITED PORCUPINE

Company Doing Aggressive Prospecting Pending Arrival of
Power From Sandy Falls.

PORCUPINE CITY, May 20.—(From Our Main Up North.)—Now that the month is drawing to a close and the hot weather is already in sight, work for the summer is being planned for on the United Porcupine property which lies two, and a half miles to the south of Golden City in the township of Whitney, where the company hold 20 acres.

During the winter months little was done in the way of prospecting except to locate quartz veins in the ridges where trenching and cross-cutting were done to determine width.

Now a force of 10 men will be set to work prospecting to locate more quartz outcroppings where trenches that have been traced thru both claims. The first in Whitney to take electrical power. Not before August 1 will the power be ready for this section of the district.

Sinking on the leads already uncovered will not start till the power is available except to get the shaft under way and collars put on to protect the work from water.

The United Porcupine Mines have two promising leads of quartz running north and south thru ridges that have been traced thru both claims. The quartz is heavily impregnated with iron. As only a few feet have been taken down, Superintendent Vail is not in a position to state what values may be expected across the entire leads which extend in many
