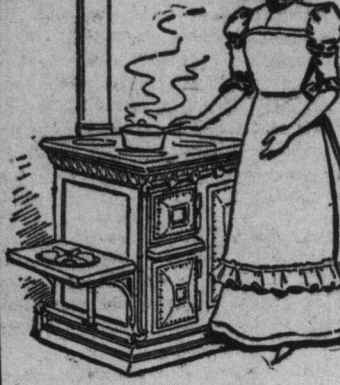

ANOTHER NIAGARA SUICIDE

Man Dressed as a Priest Sat for His Photograph and Told Where to Send It, THEN LEAPED INTO THE RIVER

Photographer Tried to Stop Him, But He Waved a Farewell and Jumped.

Niagara Falls, Ont., May 25.—Late this afternoon a man about 40 years of age, dressed in the clothing of a priest, arrived at Niagara Falls, N.Y. Reaching the northern end of the city, he visited Oehl's saloon, drank some beer, and then went to the rapids, viewed the elevator building and made the descent on the incline railway to the water's edge, immediately below the G.T.R. steel arch bridge. After spending a few minutes viewing the rushing rapids at his feet, Mr. Dietrich, the photographer, solicited him to sit for a picture, which he did, removing his hat. When it was taken he left instructions to have the photo sent to 301 Grand Street, New York City. Then, at 6:15 o'clock, deliberately, bareheaded, he walked out on the large rock projecting into the rapids. The photographer called to him, "Stop! What are you trying to do?" The man waved his hand, saying, "Goodbye," and leaped into the rapids. He was soon swept down thru the Whirlpool rapids. His hat and cane were left lying on the bench, and were handed over to the authorities.
