ROUGH ON OUTSIDE BANKS

Any Other Than National Bank Notes Must Pay a Tax of 10 Per Cent.

Washington, July 22.—The Commissioner of Internal Revenue has held that where ever Canadian bank notes or any notes, foreign or domestic, other than national bank notes are used for circulation in the United States, any banks receiving such notes, and paying them out again in the United States, are liable to a tax of 10 per cent, under section 20 of the act of Feb. 8, 1878.

CHRONOLOGY OF THE CHINESE

Who in Their Perilous Methods of War, Are But Following the Example of Moses in His Campaign Against the Midianites.

Chinese chronology, according to their ancient writers, goes back more than two million years. From the time of Confucius, who was born in 551 B.C., to the time when heaven and earth first united to produce the sun, moon and stars, the Chinese compute, was 2,267,000 years.

According to the Biblical chronology the creation of Adam, the first man, took place only about four or five thousand years before Christ. Chinese records which go back to the reign of Yao, 2336 B.C., or about the period of the Flood, according to the Biblical chronology of Archbishop Ussher (2348 B.C.).

After Yao came Shun, who was succeeded by the "Great Yu, and then the rulers grew steadily feebler and more dissolute until at last Ke, the worst of the lot, was driven from power by a popular uprising, and in 1766 B.C. Tang, the leader of the revolution, was made the first emperor of a new line called the Shang dynasty.

Simultaneously with his reign Moses was born, according to the received Biblical chronology, and the Exodus of the Israelites took place during the more vigorous period of the Shang dynasty.

Not long after this time, too, occurred the events recorded in the first chapter of Numbers. When the Israelites, in the latter part of their journey, began to encroach on the territory of the Midianites on the shores of the Arabian Gulf, the Biblical narrative tells us, Balaam (B.C. 1610), a prophet of the Midianites, a supposed diviner of a magdolan, was called into service against the Israelites. The scriptural account of the result, one of the best and most generally known of the stories of the Bible, is that Balaam's ass spoke "with man's voice," rebuked him and refused to go ahead with him. Thereafter the prophet resorted to another and more successful device to accomplish the ruin of the Israelites. He set the Midianites and Moabite women to corrupting the Israelites and enticing them to Molochian festivals.
