A number objected to clause four of the present scheme, which provides that: "All teachers in the employ of the Public School Board shall contribute to the fund, as follows, viz.: At the rate of 2 per cent. of their annual salaries for ages 20 and under, and for older ages this percentage to be increased by one-tenth of 1 per cent. of each year over 20, until the percentage reaches 5 per cent., when it remains stationary." It was claimed that this clause discriminated in favor of the older teachers, the younger members having to contribute about 50 per cent, more than the others.

It reads that: "Teachers who have taught 35 years in the Public Schools, or have reached the age of 65 years, shall be allowed to retire on a yearly allowance of one-third their last year's salary." A number of those in favor of superannuation declared the limit to be too long, and that 30 years was enough for a teacher to teach.


