HARVESTER TRUST A MONOPOLY.

The formation of the International Harvester Company just announced may or may not constitute a menace to Canadian manufacturers of agricultural implements. The new trust includes three of the biggest manufacturers in the United States with a branch factory under construction in Canada, and the capital of the gigantic concern is placed at \$120,000,000.

As pointed out by a gentleman prominently identified with the industry of farm machinery in Canada, the policy of the trust is yet unknown, but if it chose such a huge concern could slaughter its goods below cost here for a few years, thus crush out and close down the existing Canadian farm implement companies, and then prices again at its own sweet will.

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MORE GOOD TIMES.

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Another circumstance favorable to the farmer is found in the comparative good prices for cereal products current this year, and his revenue is therefore likely to be doubly enhanced. Altogether the farming class will have an unusual amount of produce to sell and of money to spend this year, and the merchant classes will do well to make extra provision wherewith to meet this happy state of affairs.

THE MUNICIPALITIES MULCTED.

The judicial committee of the Privy Council have refused to hear the appeal of the municipalities against the decision of the Ontario Court of Appeal, which declared that the act passed by the provincial government in 1901 did not amend the notorious "scrap iron" assessment. It will be remembered that Hon. Mr. Ross passed an act in that year which was ostensibly intended to give the municipalities the power to assess the plants and telephone, electric light, street railway and similar companies as "going concerns" instead of assessing the portions of their plants in each ward of a city simply as scrap iron. At the time the amendment was passed it was pointed out by the opposition and the Conservative press that the alleged amendment did not really amend the law, but that it was simply a bluffing the people while it really protected the interests of the companies.
