Prices of foodstuffs have not shown current price of 15% cents per pound for any general downward tendency recently, according to local provision dealers and butchers. Pork, bacon and egg prices have declined to some extent, but otherwise the market has remained firm, and in the case of lamb has actually advanced.

They have come via the Panama Canal. 
