

SOLDIERS RETURNED AFTER DOING A BIT

MUST CONTINUE FIGHT AGAINST RAILWAY BILL

Mayor and Controllers Back From Ottawa, But Will Have to Go Again.

Mayor Church was back in his office on Saturday morning having returned from a two days' trip to Ottawa along with several of the controllers.

The object was to oppose the Niagara, St. Catharines and Toronto Railway bill, but nothing definite was decided and the matter will come up again on Tuesday.

The bill that is being opposed covers an extension of the existing line from St. Catharines to Hamilton, the idea being to continue it as far as Toronto.

"It is purely a provincial road," said the mayor, "and the promoters should be compelled to get the legislative authority for their franchise."

COPPERS THE FEATURE OF NEW YORK MARKET

Stocks Were Weak Early in the Week, But Strengthened Materially Later.

NEW YORK, Feb. 19.—Four days of heaviness or irregularity, followed by very general recoveries, summarizes the course of this week's stock market.

Operations were influenced to an unusual extent by external affairs, revival of the Lusitania episode and uneasiness regarding conditions in Mexico being responsible for numerous early recessions in specific issues.

Another factor that militated against values was the market's weak technical condition, arising largely from a long over-extension of the bull account.

Similar conditions apply to the steel and iron industry, several of the principal manufacturers submitting very favorable reports for 1915.

Additional railway returns showing further gains in gross for January, gave promise of excellent net statement later.

Market Inactive, But Firmer Under Tontone Throat Entire List.

That traders generally are taking a saner view of the budget was apparent at the Standard Stock Exchange today, and the trading was rather inactive.

In the commodities, Apex was lightly traded in from 6 1/2 to 6. Dome Consolidated ranged from 17 to 17 1/2, closing midway between, at 17 1/2.

Hollinger was stronger, selling up from 22 1/2 to 22.25, and Jupiter held steady at 21 1/2 to 21 1/2.

Timiskaming was the strong feature opening at 54 and selling up to 56 on the close.

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Further improvement in prices was made on the Toronto Stock Exchange on Saturday.
