ENGLISH STRIKERS REFUSE TO RETURN

Not Satisfied With Terms Drawn Up by Union, and Will Stay Out.

LONDON, Dec. 6.—Many of the 1200 employees of the Great Northern Rail- way who have been on strike since Wednesday refused today to comply with the terms of the agreement for the settlement of the dispute drawn up yesterday by the trades union leaders at a conference with representatives of the board of trade. They point out that the conditions are too drastic. Besides providing that neither James, the locomotive engineer, who started the strike by refusing to haul "tainted goods," which had been handled by strike-breakers in Dublin, nor Reynolds, his comrade, who left work in sympathy with him, shall be re-em- ployed, the terms insist that all the men must express their regret and subscribe from 25 cents to 50 cents each to the Swindon Hospital. The employers also refuse to pay them for the time they were on strike.

MYSTERIOUS ROOM OF A PARIS HOTEL

Every Occupant for Last Two Years Have Met Violent Deaths.

PARIS, December 6.—One of the best-known hotels in Paris has a haunted room—a chamber of death, about a year ago—perhaps you may remember—a man and a woman were found lying dead—each shot thru the heart—side by side on the bed of a room in this hotel. For three months the death-chamber remained closed. Then, when the tragedy was beginning to be forgotten, the room was entirely renovated and once more figured in the hotel lists. An old gentleman en- gaged it one morning. That evening after leaving his room he made some mistake in entering the lift, and was crushed to death. Again the room was closed, this time for six months. The servants hushed their voices and hurried their footsteps as they passed it. About a month ago the room was again occupied—this time by a vigorous man in the prime of life. In the morning following his arrival at the hotel the waiter who brought up his coffee received no reply to his knock. Pale and trembling—for he knew the story of the room—he ran down to tell the manager. The door was forced. The occupant of the room was found dead in bed. He had suc- cumbed during the night to an embol- ism. The death-room has now been walled up.

BIG INCREASE IN U. S. IMMIGRATION

Nearly Hundred Thousand Aliens Entered During October.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6.—(Can. Press.)—There were admitted to the United States a total of 34,140 immi- grant aliens in October this year, ac- cording to the immigration statistics just issued by the bureau of immigra- tion of the department of labor. This is an increase of 25,840 over the same month last year, when 108,300 were admitted. The number admitted, how- ever, was nearly double that of Octo- ber, 1911, when 69,418 immigrant aliens entered the country. Of the number admitted last October 32,993 were males and 51,327 were females.

YONGE ST. FARM FOR ACRE LOTS

Thornhill Property Extending to Bathurst Street Changed Hands.

One of the large farms near Thorn- hill, extending from Yonge street a mile and a quarter west along a side road to Bathurst street, has changed hands, and the purchaser, Edgar T. Stephens, intends to subdivide the land and place it on the market in acre plots.
The property was owned by Nathan Boyle, and is at Stop 47, on the Met- ropolitan radial line. It contains in all 200 acres, and has a frontage of 600 feet on both Yonge and Bathurst streets. The farm is described as lot 40, 1st concession of Township of Vaughan. The deal, which involved \$70,000, was negotiated by R. M. Faulkner, real estate broker, at 138 Victoria street.

ROLLER TOWEL HANGS NO MORE UPON DOOR

Is Passing Swiftly Into Oblivion, Says Dr. Hastings.

"The roller towel is passing into oblivion in Toronto," said Dr. Hastings, M.O.H., "and other towns that follow Toronto's example in a general way are turning roller towels into mop cloths."
"It has not taken the people long to realize that roller towels are really dangerous in that they spread infec- tious diseases. Several cases of blind- ness have been traced to the use of roller towels."
"In these days of influx of humi- grants from across the Atlantic too much care cannot be taken in pre- venting the spread of infectious diseases. Besides there are altogether too many Canadians who are tem- perarily diseased in a form that is most infectious, and contaminates their roller towels or other means are especially dangerous to the eyes."

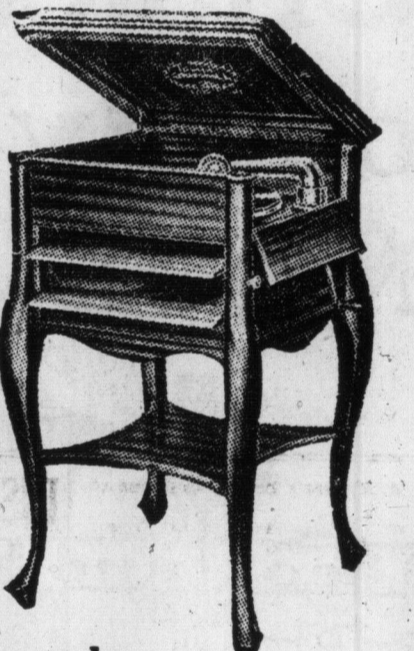

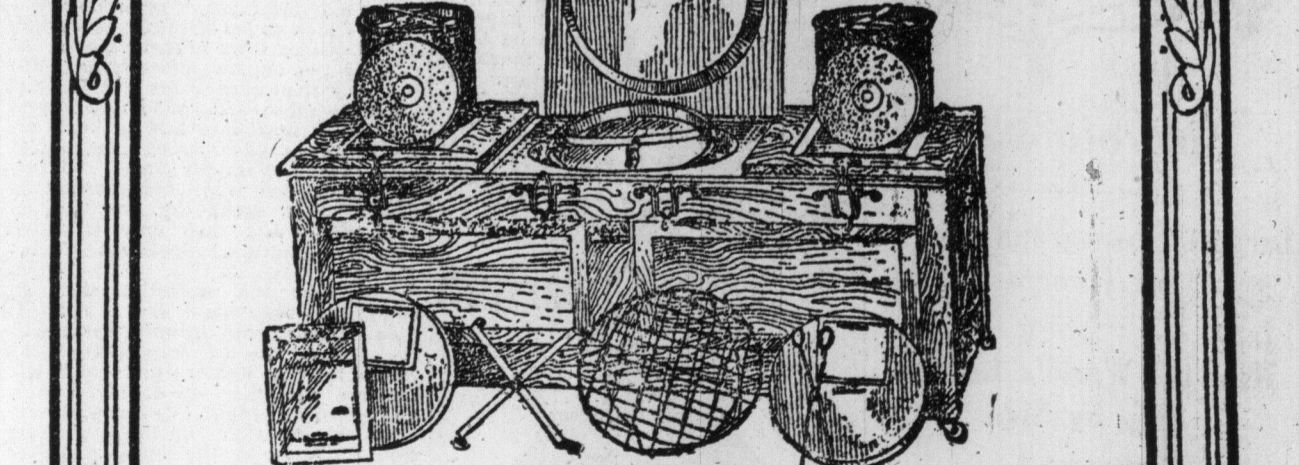
