

U. S. IMMIGRATION

Nearly Hundred Thousand Aliens Entered During October.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6.—(Can. ress.)—There were admitted to the United States a total of 134.140 immigrant aliens in October this year, ac cording to the immigration statistics just issued by the bureau of immigration of the department of labor. This is an increase of 25,840 over the same month last year, when 108,300 were admitted. The number admitted, how-ever, was nearly double that of October, 1911, when 69,418 immigrant aliens entered the country. Of the number admitted last October 82,903 were nales and 51,237 were females.


