On application duly made, the Synod granted leave to the Presbytery of London to take on trials for license Mr. James Ferguson,

The Synod also granted leave to the Presbytery of Hamilton to take on trials for license Mr. David Wardrope, Mr. John Rennie, and Mr. Thomas S. Chambers, Students.

The Synod also granted leave to the Presbytery of Montreal to take on trials for license Mr. John Anderson, Student.

The Synod then resumed consideration of the complaint and appeal in regard to the King case. Professor Young concluded his reply in behalf of the appellants, and parties were then removed.

After lengthened discussion the following decision was come to by the Synod, viz. :-

Dismiss the complaint and appeal, and sustain the decision of the Presbytery appealed against; but with the view of furnishing directions to the Presbytery in the further management of the case, with reference to the points about which a difference of opinion appears to prevail,—declare that the Synod claims no power
