RAILWAY COLLISION.

Two Big Four Passenger Trains Crash Into Each Other.

ST. LOUIS, Mo., Jan. 10.—Two Big Four passenger trains collided last night while rounding a curve between Moro and Bithalto, Ills., and so far as known this morning one fireman was killed and three persons were seriously injured. Information is, very meagre, owing to the isolation of the scene of the wreck, Some reports say that many passengers were hurt, but a message to the Associated Press by long distance telephone from a witness, is to the effect that all the passengers have escaped with minor injuries, Passengers in the day coaches were hurled from their seats and many were painfully bruised. Only the sleeping cars were left on the track. Both engines are lying on their sides. The southbound train, known as the Bosto express, was running rapidly around a curve when the northbound train, the N. Y. express, dashed into view, and the next moment a terrific collidion strewed the track with debris. The impact overturned the stoves in the day coaches and the debris took fire. Fortunately the coaches were not well filled, and the passengers succeeded in escaping from the flames. PLAGUE IN MEXICO.

Reports Said to Have Been Greatly

TUCSON, Ariz., Jan. 10.—A meeting of the town councils of Nogales, Arizona, and Nogales, Mex., has been held to protest against reports sent out about the plague in neighboring towns. Advices from Guaymas say that the business of the place has been seriously damaged by the false reports. No one is allowed to enter Guaymas without being quarantined for fourteen days outside of the city. A party of high officials is now in quarantine at the Island. At Nogales the custom officials have a thorough system of fumigation of the goods coming through from Mexico. Governor Isabel states that he is in daily communication with the governor of Sinalo regarding the plague situation, and that the reports have been greatly exaggerated. On Thursday there were 35 cases in Mazatian, of which 15 were convalescent and fourteen entirely out of danger.
