BRUSSELS, Dec. 31.—The army reorganization bill just passed by the house of representatives is important from every point of view, and marks the beginning of a new era in Beigian history. By their vote the house of representatives have signified that, in future, the Belgian army will be a factor which must be taken into account in the event of a European war. The new bill does away with the superannuated system of substitutes and puts the army on a war footing of 180,000 men. All competent Belgian military critics, of whatever political party are strongly of the opinion that the army was numerically insufficient and was threatened with complete disorganization owing to the substitutes system, long since abolished in all con-
