THE STORM ALSO STRUCK NEW YORK

And While Few Were Killed Many People Were Hurt, and Much Damage Was Done.

NEW YORK, Aug. 13.-Widespread damage was caused by a thunder storm of unusual violence that, accompanied by a high wind and a deluge of rain, burst over New York and vicinity today.

A boat house at the foot of west 122d street in which a large number of persons had taken shelter was struck by lightning and Miss Jeanette Freer, aged 20 years, was instantly killed. A dozen other persons were rendered unconscious but revived.

Five hundred immigrants were in danger for an hour when two barges on which they were barge away from the dock at Ellis Island and were blown down the bay, pitching and rolling in the heavy sea.
